The Event

Venue: Teretonga Park (2.7km circuit)

The event will be run as a Circuit Sprint (Single Car) with cars started at 5 second or greater intervals with cars released with starting order shall be fastest to slowest. There will be up to six cars on the circuit at any one time. Each track session will be for a duration of seven minutes.

Competitor requirements

Drivers must hold a minimum current drivers license or MSNZ M license.

All competitors shall wear safety apparel in compliance with Appendix Two, Schedule A.

- All competitors and passengers must wear cotton protective overalls or better approved garments. Any clothing worn under overalls must be either cotton, wool or an approved garment, this includes socks.
- All competitors and passengers must wear complete covered in footwear of leather or approved materials.
- All competitors and passengers must wear protective helmet. All passengers must sign a passenger declaration form and passenger in cage vehicles only.

Vehicle requirements

All Vehicles will go through scrutineering.

All vehicles shall comply with Appendix Five Schedule C and Appendix Two Schedule A of the current MotorSport Manual unless stated otherwise in these supplementary regulations.

Queenstown Car Club does not condone the use of race vehicles which are not registered and warranted to be driven to any of our events. If your vehicle does not meet these standards, they must be trailered or towed. Any race vehicle that is driven to scrutineering or an event which is not road legal will not be illegible for entry, and they will forfeit their entry, and will not receive a refund. It could also result in being banned from future events

Standard road tyres (DOT rated) required for all non-roll caged cars. Cars with roll cages may use slicks.

Entries

Entries will be accepted prior to race day and payment made also prior to event day. Spaces are limited so please enter and pay as soon as possible to guarantee an entry.

Entries where possible should be made through the MotorSport Online system (https:/possum.motorsport.org.nz). Any entry will not be deemed valid until payment is received.

Alternatively, entries may be submitted manually by email to queenstowncarclub@gmail.com. All such entries must be made on the correct form, must be complete in all detail, and accompanied by the appropriate fees.

The maximum number of starters will be 36. Any additional entries received will be placed on the reserve list in order of receipt.

No entries will be permitted on the day

Acceptance will at the clerk of the Course's discretion. Event organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with the prescribed provisions of the National Sporting code.

In signing the entry forms, competitors are deemed to fully understand the relevant articles and regulations as contained in the Motorsport NZ manual.

General

Track Access will be strictly controlled from the pit area.

All cars will remain in the pit area until directed on to the circuit.

Competitors are responsible for their crews and guests at all times. Please ensure all non-competing persons are within designated spectator or pit areas.

Alcohol will not be permitted.

Drivers briefing is compulsory and a roll call of entered drivers will be taken.

Toilet facilities are available onsite

Bring your own food and drink.

Health and Safety

The health and safety of our Club Officials and competitors is foremost in the way Queenstown Car Club manage their events. Health and Safety will be discussed at the event briefing prior to the event commencing.

Competitors and crews must respect this private property, drive slowly on access roads and take all rubbish away
